PORAM MANAGEMENT BOARD REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31 DECEMBER 2007

A. GENERAL

The 29th. Annual General Meeting was held on 3 May 2007 at the Equatorial Hotel, Kuala Lumpur. Mr. Richard Cheang (PGEO Edible Oils Sdn. Bhd.) was elected Chairman, whilst YBhg. Dato' Low Mong Hua (Southern Edible Oil Industries (M) Sdn. Bhd.) was elected as the 1st. Vice-Chairman.

Mr. R. Venugopal (Cargill Palm Products Sdn. Bhd.) was also elected as the Treasurer. The other elected Management Board members were YBhg. Dato' Er Kok Leong (Lam Soon Edible Oils Sdn. Bhd.), En. Wan Mohd. Zain Wan Ismail (Felda Vegetable Oil Products Sdn. Bhd.), Mr. Yong Chin Fatt (IOI Edible Oils Sdn. Bhd.) and Mr. Yap Chuan Yu (Kempas Edible Oil Sdn. Bhd.).

The Chairman, in accordance with the Constitution of the Association appointed YBhg. Dato' Er Kok Leong as the 2nd. Vice-Chairman. Mr. Wee Fang Peng (Felda Johore Bulkurs Sdn. Bhd.) and Mr. Richard Goh (KL Maritime Sdn. Bhd.) were co-opted into the Management Board, representing the interests of the Associate Members.

Towards the end of December 2007, Mr. Richard Cheang retired from PGEO Edible Oils Sdn. Bhd. Under the provisions of the PORAM Constitution, Mr. Cheang had to vacate his position as Chairman of PORAM. YBhg. Dato' Low Mong Hua was later appointed as the PORAM Acting Chairman. However, with profound sadness YBhg. Dato' Low Mong Hua passed away peacefully on 13 April 2008. Mr. Yong Chin Fatt was then appointed as the Acting Chairman on 24 April 2008 for the remaining duration of the current term of the Management Board.

The highlights for year 2007 were the PORAM annual events (forum, industry golf game and annual dinner) held on 30 November and 1 December 2007. All these three events were officiated/attended by YB Datuk Peter Chin Fah Kui, Minister of Plantation Industries and Commodities and were well supported by PORAM, industry members and agencies. The revised FOB contracts and PORAM Rules of Arbitration and Appeal, which took effect on 1 January 2008, were officially launched by the Minister at the forum.

B. MARKET REVIEW

As at end 2007, 66 refining licences with a total capacity of 23.383 million tonnes were approved by MIDA. 52 refineries were in operation with a total capacity of 19.192 million tonnes.

The production of CPO declined marginally by 0.4% to 15.8 million tonnes in 2007 from 15.9 million tonnes in the previous year. The decline was mainly attributed to the effects of flood damage during the early part of the year and biological stress, which affected the palm trees especially during the first half of 2007. The total exports of oil palm products, constituting palm oil, palm kernel oil, palm kernel cake, oleochemicals and finished products declined by 3.0 % to 19.56 million tonnes in 2007 from 20.16 million tonnes recorded in 2006. The total export earnings, however, increased by 41.8% or RM 13.3 billion to RM 45.1 billion compared to RM 31.8 billion in 2006. Exports of most of the oil palm products registered declines in 2007 compared to the previous year, led by finished products with a decline of 16.5%, followed by palm oil and palm kernel cake falling by 4.8% and 1.9% respectively. Exports of palm kernel oil and oleochemicals, however, increased by 14.1% and 3.4% respectively.

Exports of palm oil declined by 4.8 % to 13.74 million tonnes from 14.42 million tonnes in 2006. China, P.R maintained its position as the biggest export market for Malaysian palm oil for the sixth consecutive year, with off-take totalling 3.84 million tonnes or 27.9% of total palm oil exports, followed by the European Union 2.06 million tonnes (15.0%) , Pakistan 1.07 million tonnes (7.8%), USA 0.79 million tonnes (5.8%), Japan 0.53 million tonnes (3.8%) and India 0.51 million tonnes (3.7%). Together these six (6) countries accounted for 8.81 million tonnes or 64.1% of total Malaysian palm oil exports in 2007. Exports of finished products declined by 16.5% to 351,183 tonnes from 420,650 tonnes in 2006. The major markets for palm oil finished products in 2007 were Russia (10.4% of total exports of finished products), the European Union (8.4%), Pakistan (7.3%), Saudi Arabia (6.6%) and Kuwait (5.8%). The major products exported under this group was shortening, accounting for 189,453 tonnes or 54.0% of total finished product exports.

The average price of oil palm products in the domestic market rose sharply in 2007. The firmness in prices was influenced by the structural changes in the global oils and fats supply and demand and the increase in crude oil

price. CPO price is now closely correlated to that of crude oil and often moves in tandem with it. The average CPO price increased by 67.5% or RM1,020.00 to RM2,530.50 in 2007 against RM1,510.50 in the previous year. The average export price for processed palm oil products also increased, namely, RBD palm oil by RM1,106.00 or 72.1% to RM2,640.00; RBD palm olein by RM966.50 or 59.6% to RM2,588.00; and RBD palm stearin by RM1,015.50 or 67.9% to RM2,511.50.

C. LIAISON AND CONSULTATION WITH THE GOVERNMENT

I. Ministry of Plantation Industries and Commodities (KPPK)

Close consultations with the Ministry continued throughout the year under review. PORAM participated in the Ministry's visits to EU and Pakistan (POTS). These visits were led by YB Datuk Peter Chin Fah Kui, Minister of Plantation Industries and Commodities (KPPK). Meetings were also held with YB KPPK Minister on issues relating to the implementation of the IMO Revised MARPOL Annex II regulations enforced on 1 January 2007 and the training and human resource needs of the Malaysian palm oil industry.

Since the signing of the 2006 Memorandum of Understanding between Malaysia and Indonesia on Bilateral Cooperation on Commodities, several Joint Ministerial, Senior Officials and Working Group meetings had taken place, both in Indonesia and Malaysia. PORAM continued its support and participation in the Working Group on Palm Oil and several Technical Groups established under this Working Group on Palm Oil. Among the areas of cooperation discussed included biofuel/biodiesel, global palm oil market position, joint investments in Indonesia and Malaysian oil palm industries and exchange of oil palm germplasm, joint R&D and capacity building activities.

PORAM again supported and participated in the Malaysia International Commodity Conference and Showcase (MICCOS) 2007 organised by KPPK from 3-8 July 2007 in Kuala Lumpur. The Association also attended the briefing session on Human Resources Development Fund (HRDF) in September 2007. This session was coordinated by KPPK and held at the office of Pembangunan Sumber Manusia Berhad.

PORAM was also invited to attend meetings convened by KPPK on the following subjects :

- WTO/FTA negotiations and developments. Preparatory meetings on bilateral dialogue sessions between KPPK and the State Governments of Terengganu, Johore and Kedah.
- Human capital development and competitiveness in the plantations and commodities sector.
- Preparation of the concept paper on the implementation of palm oil industrial clusters in other areas in Malaysia (along the Lahad Datu POIC model).
- Trilateral Malaysia/Indonesia/Netherlands Partnership.
- Anti-palm oil campaign and the issue of sustainability.
- Cooking Oil Price Stabilisation Scheme (COSS)
- EC Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation of Chemicals (REACH) Regulation.

II. Malaysian Palm Oil Board (MPOB)

PORAM and its members continued to support MPOB on its annual/biannual programmes such as the MPOB Palm Oil Familiarisation Programme, the MPOB International Palm Oil Conference (PIPOC), the Programme Advisory Committee Public Seminar, the Transfer of Technology Seminar and the MPOB Oil Palm Products Surveying Course.

The Association was also represented in various committees/working groups formed by MPOB to address related issues :-

- National Codex Sub-Committee on Fats and Oils
- MPOB Working Group on the Code of Practice for the Production of Palm Products
- MPOB Working Group on Palm Oil (Malaysia-Indonesia Bilateral Cooperation)
- MPOB Working Group on Cooking Oil Price Stabilisation Scheme (COSS)
- MPOB Committee on Oils and Fats Standards
- National Coordinating Committee on Palm Oil (Trilateral Malaysia/Indonesia/Netherlands Partnership)
- MPOB Surveyors' Examination Panel
- MPOB Surveying Committee on Oil Palm Products Surveying Course

A MPOB/PORAM committee was also established to organize the first-ever joint training programme on An Introductory Course on Trading and Marketing of Palm Oil. This course has been scheduled on 5-8 May 2008 in MPOB Bangi.

III. Malaysian Palm Oil Council (MPOC)

PORAM continued to maintain regular dialogue and contacts with MPOC and its officials. MPOC also regularly provided PORAM with its informative publications and kept the Association abreast on current issues. PORAM members also participated in the various MPOC programmes such as the Palm Oil Trade Fair and Seminar (POTS) 2007 held in Pakistan, UAE and South Africa, Familiarisation Programme for US Industry Members and the Malaysian Palm Oil Leadership Dinner, where the new MPOC logo was launched by YB Datuk Peter Chin Fah Kui, Minister of Plantation Industries and Commodities.

MPOC also joined hands with PORAM in hosting the Palm Oil Industry Annual Golf Game and participated as a special sponsor in the PORAM Annual Forum.

IV. Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI)

During the period under review, PORAM was invited to attend several meetings convened by MITI, to discuss issues on :

- Malaysia – Pakistan Closer Economic Partnership Agreement
- Preparatory meeting of the Third Working Group on Industrial Cooperation (Food Processing) of Developing-8(D8) (D8 countries comprised of Indonesia, Malaysia, Nigeria, Turkey, Egypt, Iran, Bangladesh and Pakistan)
- ASEAN-China Early Harvest Programme (Shortening)
- Review of the Industrial Master Plan 3 – Manufacturing Sector Working Group (Oil Palm – based Industry)

D. LIAISON WITH INTERNATIONAL AND LOCAL ORGANISATIONS

Close contacts/consultations/meetings were held with the following organizations :

I. International Organisations

i. Pakistan Vanaspati Manufacturers Association (PVMA)

A joint PORAM/PVMA meeting was held on 13 March 2007 in Kuala Lumpur. PORAM representatives were also present when the PVMA delegation paid a courtesy call on YB Datuk Peter Chin Fah Kui, Minister of Plantation Industries and Commodities on 14 March 2007.

ii. Federation of Oils, Seeds & Fats Associations Limited (FOSFA International)

Correspondences were held on matters relating to the Joint Price Settlement Committee and the FOSFA Heating Recommendations.

iii. National Institute of Oilseed Products (NIOP)

Periodical circulars were received from the NIOP.

iv. Asean Vegetable Oils Club (AVOC)

The Malaysian Industry Associations – PORAM, MEOMA and MPOA, hosted the 12th. Annual General Meeting and 27th. Board of Directors Meeting of AVOC on 10 February 2007 in Kuala Lumpur. PORAM representatives also participated in the 28th. AVOC Board of Directors meeting held on 29 September 2007 in Bangkok, Thailand. PORAM officially transferred the AVOC Secretariatship to MPOA in April 2007.

v. Roundtable on Sustainable Palm Oil (RSPO)

PORAM representatives attended the Roundtable RT5 meeting held on 20-22 November 2007 in Kuala Lumpur as well as other meetings/public seminars convened by RSPO and MPOA throughout the year.

II. Local Organisations

i. Malayan Edible Oil Manufacturers' Association (MEOMA)

The proposed merger exercise between PORAM and MEOMA was abandoned since MEOMA officially notified PORAM that it did not want to pursue further on this merger initiative after due deliberations by its General Working Committee.

ii. Malaysian Palm Oil Association (MPOA)

The Association maintained close rapport with MPOA especially on common issues affecting the industry such as the MPOB Codes of Practices, RSPO developments, trade contracts, Malaysia-Indonesia Bilateral Cooperation, Tripartite Partnership and Codex. PORAM also supported the MPOA Annual Dinner held on 5 May 2007.

iii. Bursa Malaysia

PORAM representatives participated regularly in the Bursa Malaysia Industry Consultation sessions concerning the US\$ Crude Palm Oil Futures.

E. COMMITTEES

I. Commercial and Technical Committee

Chairman : YBhg. Dato' Er Kok Leong

The Committee met four times during the period under review. The Committee established three Working Groups – Technical, Markets and Contracts, which meet on need basis or conduct the exchange of views on issues via electronic correspondence.

The following were some of the subjects deliberated by the Committee :

a. Domestic Cooking Oil Price Stabilisation Scheme (COSS)

This COSS Scheme was implemented by the Government on 1 June 2007 for a one-year period. This scheme is currently being reviewed by the Government.

b. International Maritime Organisation (IMO)

In view of the new IMO regulations under MARPOL Annex II, PORAM introduced the listing of viscosity range on four products, namely, RBD Palm Oil, Palm Olein, Palm Stearin and PFAD, and amended the PORAM Recommended Range of Temperature at time of loading/discharge for Palm Olein (Crude/Processed) from 30°C – 35°C to 32°C – 35°C.

c. MPOB Standard Surveying Practices

The MPOB Standard Surveying Procedures and Practice for Palm Oil and its Derivatives (First Edition) was introduced by MPOB in April 2007.

d. MPOB Codes of Practices for the Production of Palm Products

MPOB has introduced the following Codes of Practices :

- Code of Good Agricultural Practice (GAP) for Oil Palm Estate and Smallholdings
- Code of Good Manufacturing Practice for Palm Oil Mills
- Code of Good Practice for Palm Kernel Crushers
- Code of Good Refining Practice for Palm Oil Refineries
- Code of Good Practice for the Handling, Transport and Storage of Products for the Handling, Transport and Storage of Products from the Oil Palm

These documents are for adoption by the industry on voluntary basis.

e. Revised FOB Contracts

The following contracts :

and the PORAM Rules of Arbitration and Appeal were amended and the revised versions took effect on 1 January 2008.

f. FOSFA 81 CIF Contract

Amendments were made to the FOSFA International/PORAM Standard Contractual Methods List.

g. WTO/FTA/Market Developments

The DOHA Round of Negotiations have not seen much progress or positive conclusions yet. On 1 January 2008, the Malaysia-Pakistan Closer Economic Partnership Agreement came into force. This Agreement is significant to the Malaysian palm oil industry as tariff rates on several major Malaysian palm oil products have been reduced by 10% margin of preference beginning 1 January 2008 and a further 5% come 1 January 2010.

h. RSPO

The RSPO Certification Scheme for Sustainable Palm Oil was launched by YB Datuk Peter Chin Fah Kui at RT5, Kuala Lumpur.

i. Codex Committee on Fats and Oils (CCFO)

PORAM participated in the CCFO meeting in London (February 2007). A matter of concern was on the proposal by Indonesia to reduce the CPO carotene level from 500 – 2000 mg/kg to the new range of 400-2000 mg/kg. Issues relating to the Acceptable Previous Cargoes List were also monitored.

j. EU REACH

The European Union Council on 18 December 2006 adopted the Registration, Evaluation and Authorisation of Chemicals Regulation (REACH). This regulation came into force on 1 June 2007 and covers all substances whether manufactured, imported, used as intermediates or placed on the market, either on their own or in articles. This regulation among other things requires manufacturers and importers of substances to obtain information on the substances they manufacture or import and this information has to be registered with the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA).

Though substances for food and feed ingredients are reported to be exempted from the regulation, those for non-food use may have to pre-register. Malaysia has appealed to the EU to have palm oil, palm kernel oil and some of their derivatives, including their methyl esters, exempted from the regulation. EU discussion on this matter has been deferred till end 2008.

II. Price Settlement Committee

Chairman : Mr. Chua Seow Yang

The Committee continued to provide settlement prices request from the trade as well as arbitrators for the purpose of settlement of disputes.

III. Associate Members Committee

Chairman : Mr. Richard Goh

The Committee held a joint luncheon meeting with the Price Settlement Committee at the Eden@Chulan Square Restaurant, Kuala Lumpur on 26 June 2007. The meeting was chaired by PORAM Chairman, Mr. Richard Cheang.

F. TRAINING AND EDUCATION

For the year under review, the following activities were organized:-

i. Interaction Session for New Arbitrators – 7 February 2007

This half-day Interaction Session was held in the afternoon of 7 February 2007 at the Saujana Kuala Lumpur, Saujana Resort, Shah Alam, Selangor. It was designed to acquaint the newly appointed arbitrators on PORAM, the Malaysian Palm Oil Industry and the PORAM Arbitration and Appeal process.

ii. PORAM Course on Operational Aspects of Palm Oil Trade – 7 & 9 February 2007

The Course was held at the Saujana Kuala Lumpur, Saujana Resort, Shah Alam, Selangor. This two-day course on “Operational Aspects of Palm Oil Trade” was to provide participants with an overview on the various aspects of palm oil trade including PORAM Contracts, quality issues as well as latest development in shipping regulations that affect the palm oil industry. Case studies on past arbitrated cases were introduced at this event. Several members of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators (CI Arb) served as facilitators for the case studies. The Course attracted 90 participants.

iii. Trade Briefing and Interaction Session on the Proposed Amendments to PORAM/MEOMA FOB Contract and PORAM Rules of Arbitration and Appeal, 12 May 2007

This event was held on Saturday, 12 May 2007 at the Equatorial Hotel, Kuala Lumpur. The main purpose of the session was to inform the trade on the proposed amendments to on the FOB contract and at the PORAM Rules of Arbitration and Appeal and to obtain relevant feedback from the trade on the amendments. The half-day morning programme was moderated by En. Kassim Salleh whereas presentations were made by Mr. Raj Kumar Shah and Mr. Prem Gurbani, a lawyer who assisted PORAM in this review exercise. 110 participants attended the events.

iv. PORAM/MPOB Palm Oil Familiarization Programme (POFP), 17 August 2007

The annual Joint PORAM/MPOB Programme was held at the Prince Hotel & Residence, Kuala Lumpur. This event provided networking opportunities between PORAM members and the foreign participants. Besides a briefing on PORAM, an overview on the

prospects of Malaysian Palm Oil in Russia, South Africa, Philippines and UAE was presented by a representative from these countries. About 100 people attended this programme.

G. ARBITRATION AND APPEAL (JANUARY TO DECEMBER 2007)

A total of 8 new arbitration cases were filed with the PORAM Secretariat for the duration of January to December 2007.

In order to further enhance and strengthen the arbitration machinery, the PORAM appointed five professional arbitrators to serve in the PORAM Arbitration Panel. The arbitrators, who are members of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators Malaysia (CIArb), have been appointed for a two-year term.
